I am pleased and honored to write this letter on behalf of Jack Harden. On top of that, he played with honor and integrity which was an approach he spread throughout our whole team. Our team not only respects Jack as our best player, they admire him because he is an inspiring leader. While I am not connected to the Model United Nations Team, I imagine those same qualities are why he was chosen as their President this year and why he was selected as a junior to lead our top team members in a competition in Rome, where they came back as the best team from a field of 16 international teams.
